#### Charter -- Constitution -- History

#### I. Membership

- A. Any Hoffman Estates High School student is eligible to become a member.
- B. Any student from other schools may be made a special member.
- C. Students become members by attending, working for, or donating to any German Club activity.
- D. Every German Club activity is worth at least one membership point.
- E. Any member with only two points at semester break must gain at least one new point to regain membership for the rest of the school year.

#### II. Elections and Duties of Officers

#### A. <u>Elections</u>

- 1. The first meeting of the school year shall be devoted to the election of officers.
- 2. Students who have not been in German Club the previous year are not eligible to hold an office.

#### B. Duties of Officers

#### 1. President

- a. presides over meetings
- b. works closely with sponsor
- c. supervises all activities of the club

#### 2. Vice-President

- a. works closely with the president
- b. takes attendance
- c. takes over the president's duties in case of the president's absence

#### 3. Secretary/Treasurer

- a. takes minutes of the meetings
- b. takes care of official correspondence
- c. keeps a parallel record of the club's financial account

#### 4. Activity Coordinator

- a. works closely with sponsor in planning and working out details of all club activities
- b. organizes all publicity for events of the club
- c. is responsible for photos and other materials to be used in scrapbook
